

Downloading Images from the Internet

FIRST THINGS FIRST

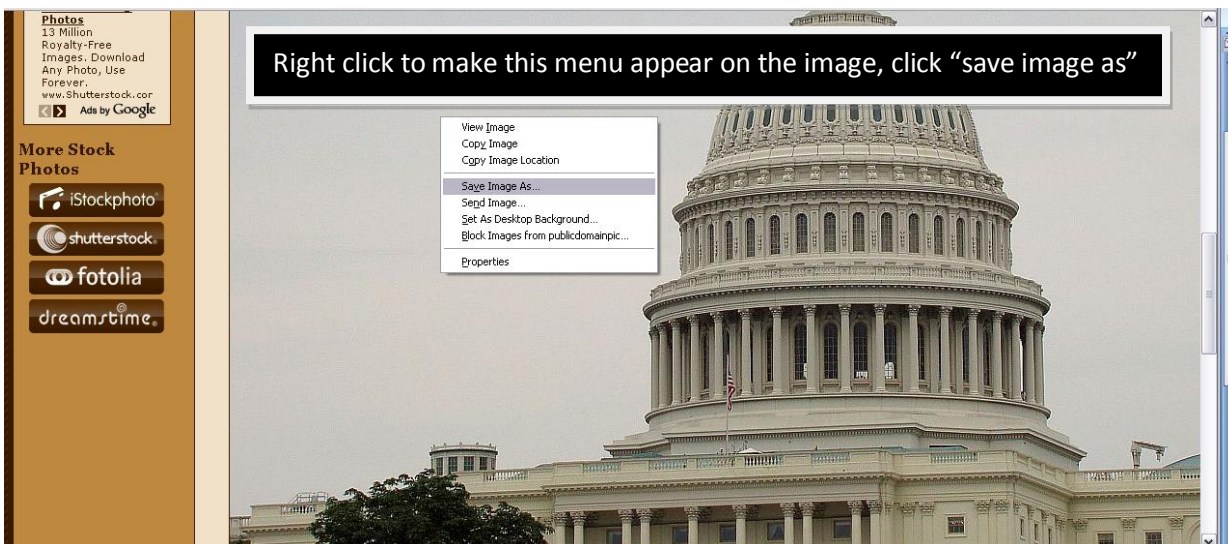
Should you be using the image you are downloading? Do you know what the terms of use are? If yes, continue...
If no, see the [copyright page](#).

Most sites will allow you to save an image to your computer multiple ways. Please follow the steps below to ensure that you get the highest resolution (quality) available to you.

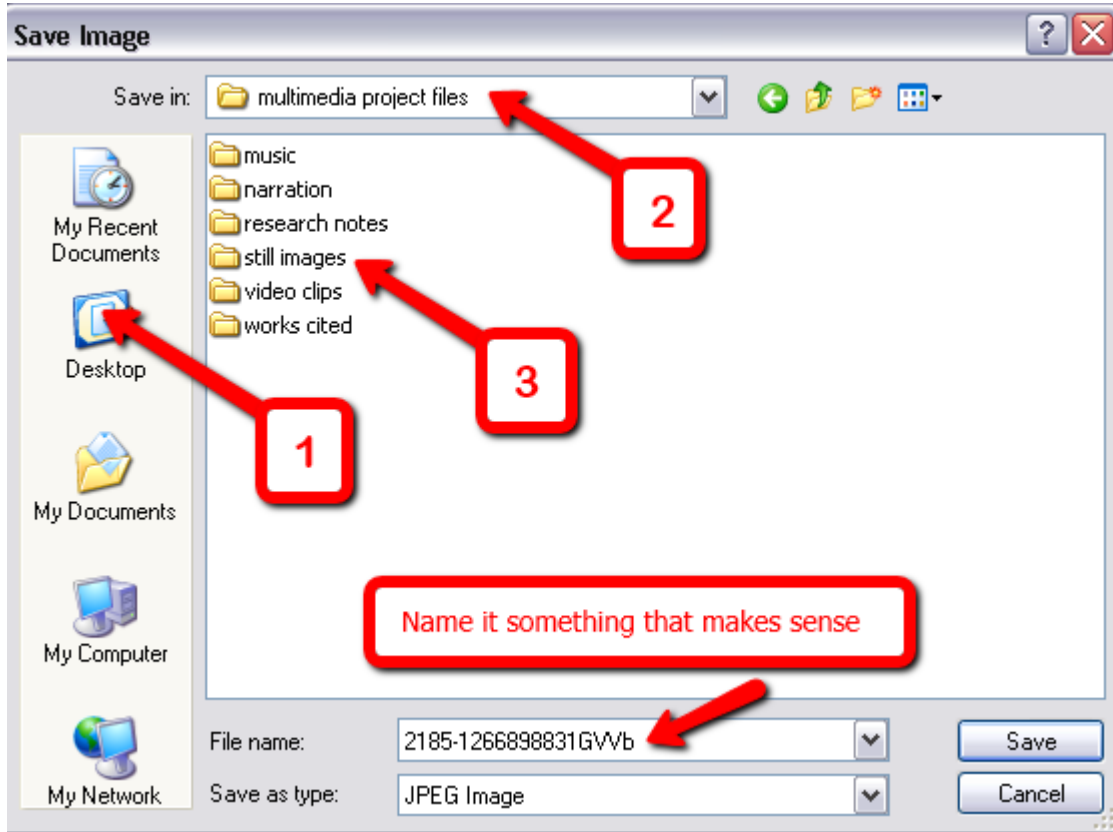
1. Using the resources provided on the Wiki, find an image.
2. Confirm that the terms of use allow you to use it for this project.
Most of the time you will be searching through thumbnails, or small versions of the images. Do not save the thumbnail, this is exactly that, a thumbnail size image.
3. Click on the thumbnail image, it will probably open larger. If when you hover over the image you see the hand icon, that means you can click again and make it even larger – the larger the better – so keep clicking until it stops getting larger.



4. Once you have made it as large as it will go, right click on the image.
5. A small menu will open. Select “save image as” from the menu.



6. Remember file management? When the save box opens, you MUST navigate to the images folder in your project folder. It should be here:
- Desktop
 - multimedia research files (folder)
 - still images n(folder)
 - change the file name if the default doesn't tell you what the image is
 - click save



Don't forget to document as you go!

Document where you got the image **NOW** on your notes page.

At a minimum, describe what it is, any specific terms of use, past a copy of the url, and note the date you got it.

Example:

ALWAYS COPY AND PASTE THE WEB ADDRESS FOR ALL INFORMATION SO YOU CAN CORRECTLY CITE IT.
